In the 1870s and 1880s, Joseph Cook was a fiery young congregational minister in the industrial town of Lynn, Massachusetts. The lectures touch on such topics as child labor, social control, urbanization, the theater and the press with Cook always vehemently opposing the evils of the factory system.
